



STANDING ORDER REGARDING ELECTRONIC DEVICES

The United States District Court for the Northern District of Mississippi has entered a Temporary Standing Order Regarding Electronic Devices, dated August 7, 2014 (the "Temporary Standing Order"), which applies to all courthouses throughout the Northern District of Mississippi where a United States District Judge is stationed. A copy of the Temporary Standing Order is attached hereto as Exhibit A. For the avoidance of doubt and to promote uniformity throughout the district, the Temporary Standing Order is adopted and the provisions stated therein shall also be in effect with regard to the Thad Cochran United States Bankruptcy Courthouse located in Aberdeen, Mississippi.

In addition, the taking of photographs, video or audio recordings, or externally broadcasting by any electronic means, in or from the courtroom or courthouse is prohibited, regardless of whether court is actually in session.



**TEMPORARY STANDING ORDER
REGARDING ELECTRONIC DEVICES**

Electronic devices capable of transmitting images or messages are prohibited in the courtroom except when such equipment is being utilized by attorneys and support personnel directly involved in the litigation before the Court. Cellular telephones must be turned off or in the vibrate/silent mode in the courtroom. These provisions may be relaxed or modified in the discretion of the presiding judge, unless otherwise prohibited by statute, rule or Judicial Conference Policy.
